## course description

“Common Goals, Different Roads: Approved Supervision Across Mental Health Disciplines” is a 15-hour course for LICSWs, LASWs, LMFTs, and LMHCs in Washington that provides the knowledge base needed to be an approved supervisor. The course is designed to identify and implement the approaches of clinical social work, marriage and family therapy, and mental health counseling to supervision of licensure candidates, certified counselors, and certified advisors.

The course includes:

- Answers to questions about the registered counselor reorganization.
- A thorough review of supervision literature
- Complete review of Washington laws and rules on approved supervision.
- Interactive discussion and small groups of supervision principles.
- Documentation of attendance and completion of this course.

Becoming an approved supervisor is a process that requires knowledge of the supervision process, ethics in supervision, Washington laws and rules, the role of diversity in supervision, and the ability to help super-

visees with clients who face a wide variety of difficulties emotionally and/or in daily life. This course will give licensed clinicians the knowledge base needed to help their supervisees navigate these issues in agencies or in private practice. The supervisory relationship itself will be explored as a reflection of the process between the supervisee and client.

Get answers to your approved supervision questions such as:

- What are the similarities and differences in supervision practice across disciplines?
- What are the legal and ethical responsibilities of the supervisor for the practice of the supervisee?
- What does an approved supervisor in private practice need to know about agency practice?
- How does a non-agency supervisor coordinate with an agency approved supervisor?
- How does the registered counselor reorganization affect approved supervision?
- How does the new mandatory reporting rule affect approved supervision?
- How do issues of diversity affect the supervisee, client, and approved supervisor?

**Lisa Erickson**, LMHC, past-president of WMHCA, mental health counselor in private practice, and frequent speaker on ethics and supervision.

**Laura Groshong**, LICSW, clinical social worker in private practice, WSSCSW legislative chair, registered lobbyist, author of *Clinical Social Work Regulation and Practice* (in press), director of government relations for the Clinical Social Work Association.

**Kevin Host**, LICSW, director of EAP Services for Family Services, president of Clinical Social Work Association, extensive experience as a supervisor and therapist.

**Carlton Munson**, LCSW, prolific author, including *Handbook of Clinical Social Work Supervision*, frequent speaker on clinical social work supervision, and professor at University of Maryland.

**Carolyn Sharp**, LICSW, clinical social worker who has worked extensively with children and as a supervisor of work with children.
